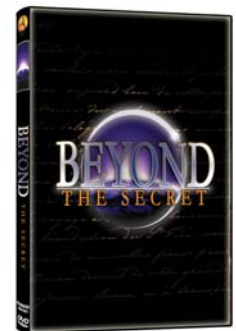
Community Education Classes Sponsored by Excelsior Springs Hospital
